Window View

36" x 42" • Beginner Skills

This easy pattern is the perfect way to frame that gorgeous panel that stopped you in your tracks!

Choose a palette of fabrics to complement it, and let's get started on something simply beautiful!



Fabric Preparation & Cutting

Heat-n-Bond Lite

• Cut (2) strips 11/2" x 44"

Center Panel

• Trim to 18½" x 24½"

Even if you do not usually pre-wash, at least pre-wash the Panel.

White

• Cut (8) 2" x WOF strips

Novelty Print

• Fussy-cut (18) 31/2" squares: Shape A

Light Blue

- Cut (2) strips 2" wide
- Sub-cut (18) rectangles 2" x 3½": Shape B

Pink

- Cut (2) strips 2" wide
- Sub-cut (18) rectangles 2" x 3½": Shape B

Light Green

• Cut (2) strips 3½" x WOF

Yellow

• Cut (2) strips 3½" x WOF

Dark Blue

- Fuse (1) 11/2" strip of Heat-n-Bond Lite to fabric
- Cut (1) 3/4" strip from the fused fabric
- Sub-cut (36) $\frac{3}{4}$ " x $\frac{3}{4}$ " squares: Shape C

Dark Green

- Fuse (1) 11/2" strip of Heat-n-Bond Lite to fabric
- Cut (1) 3/4" strip from the fused fabric
- Sub-cut (36) 3/4" x 3/4" squares: Shape C

Purple

• Cut (4) 11/2" x WOF strips for Inner Border

Large Print

• Cut (4) 21/2" x WOF strips for Outer Border

Binding Fabric

- Cut (5) 21/2" x WOF strips
- Join to create one strip, at least 116" long, for Binding

If the trimmed Panel is too small after washing & pressing, add Coping Strips:

Using the Large Scale
Print, cut 2 strips
I 1/2" × WOF from leftover
fabric...you'll have plenty!
Attach the strips to sides,
top and bottom to bring the
size of the Panel to size,
trimming as needed.

Shape Key










Piece the Window Blocks Make the Window Center Sections

• Attach one Light Blue Shape B to the left side of each Shape A. Press seams toward the smaller piece.





- Attach Pink Shape B to the right side of Shape A. Press seams toward the smaller piece.
- Make (18) 6½" x 3½" Window Center Sections.


Make the Window Top Sections and Window Bottom Sections

- Sew a White 2" x WOF strip onto both sides of one 3½" x WOF Light Green strip, pressing seams toward the Light Green fabric. Press seams to larger piece.
- · Repeat to make a second strip set.
- Cut each strip set into (9) 61/2" x 21/2" sections for a total of (18) Pieced Window Top Sections.

Repeat the steps for the Window Top Sections, using the remaining White 2" x WOF strips and Yellow 31/2" x WOF strips. Create a total of (18) 61/2" x 21/2" Pieced Window Bottom Sections.








Create strip sets; subcut.

Assemble the Window View Blocks

- Following the diagram at right, piece one Window Top, one Window Center, and one Window Bottom Section.


 Press seams open.
- Make a total of (18) $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " Window View Blocks.



Make 18.

Appliqué the Window View Blocks

- Fuse (2) Dark Blue Shape C pieces and (2) Dark Green Shape C pieces to an assembled Window View Block as shown.
- Stitch around each fused shape with a zig-zag or decorative stitch, using your choice of thread.
- Appliqué (18) blocks.



Make 18.



Quilt Top Assembly

Referring to the diagram below, assemble the Window View quilt top:

- Sew two sets of (3) Window View Blocks together.
- Add them to the top and bottom of the $18\frac{1}{2}$ " x $24\frac{1}{2}$ " Panel. Press seams toward Panel.
- Sew two sets of (6) Window View Blocks together.
- · Sew them to both sides of the center.
- Sew the Inner Border to each side of the quilt center, then the top and bottom.
- Sew the Outer Border to each side of the quilt center, then the top and bottom.



Depending on original size, your Panel may have Coping Strips added to the edges to create the needed 18½" x 24½" size. See page 4 for details.

Finishing

- Layer the quilt top, batting and backing.
- Quilt as desired! I echo-quilted the Panel area, outlining the motif with flowy, freehand lines of stitching. The pieced areas are quilted in a simple stipple. Let me know how you quilt yours!
- Bind using your favorite traditional method.


⅔ yard	Center Panel	⅓ yard	Dark Green
½ yard	White	⅓ yard	Purple
½ yard	Novelty Print	5⁄8 yard	Large Scale Print
⅓ yard	Light Blue	½ yard	Binding
⅓ yard	Pink	2½ yards	Backing; includes 4" overage on all sides
⅓ yard	Light Green		
⅓ yard	Light Yellow	-44" x 50"	Batting; includes 4" overage on all sides
1/4 yard	Dark Blue
